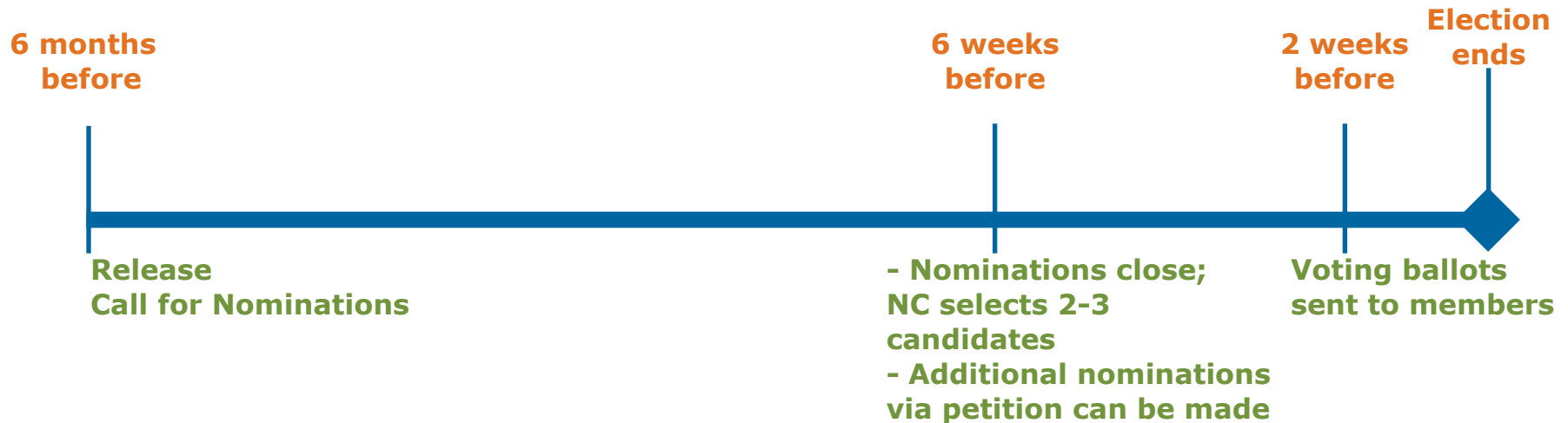
# MGA Operations Manual

▶ Section 9.9 -5 pages long

- ▶ AGs officers should be at least: chair, vice-chair, secretary and treasurer (secretary and treasurer can be merged in just one position)
- ▶ The committee members can be of any IEEE membership grade EXCEPT FOR STUDENTS
- ▶ Committee members are elected every 1-2 years
- ▶ You can hold the same position for only 4 years consecutively, and 6 years in total

# How to run elections

- ▶ Technically....you need:
  - Nomination committee and a tellers committee



# Activities

- ▶ At least 2 group-interest meetings every year
- ▶ The meetings must be reported at least once a year
- ▶ Meetings contribute to calculating the AG rebate and Activity bonus (if applicable)
- ▶ If an AG fails to do this:
  - after one year with less than 2 activities the group: automatically placed on probation; will last for 3 consecutive years (no matter what you do)
  - being under probation suspends your rights to the rebate
  - AG will be dissolved automatically if situation does not improve.

# Programs and Funding Opportunities

# Student Transition and Elevation Partnership

- ▶ Lovingly nicknamed **STEP**
- ▶ Normally **\$500** funding from MGA
- ▶ You need to get at least **10 recent graduates** at the event
- ▶ If there are more than 25 recent graduates at the event, sponsorship might be slightly increased
- ▶ Limited to **one event** per Section per year



# Community Engagement Workshop

- ▶ Aim: bring people of different professional backgrounds together to **tackle a problem** in their local community

**A CEW is an effort to understand and analyze existing problems in a local community and possibly educate people about its solutions.**

- ▶ **\$500** funding from MGA YP and IEEE SIGHT
- ▶ Minimum **10 IEEE members** involved (can include students)
- ▶ **Once a year** per Section

# **2016 IEEE Constitutional Amendments Vote**

15 August through 3 October

**1: IEEE Constitutional amendment: to be voted on by membership**

**2: Proposed optimized Board structure: to be approved or rejected by the BoD**

IEEE Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors proposes revisions to the IEEE Constitution and recommends each IEEE member vote **FOR** the amendment. If adopted, these modifications improve the members' voice in governing IEEE and allow future changes to the organizational structure to better respond to the demands of a complex and changing world.

(January 2016)

Allows directors to be elected by the full eligible voting membership of IEEE

Adds language encouraging a diverse Board of Directors

Separates the role of an IEEE delegate from an IEEE director

Establish a new role for IEEE delegates, who are members of the IEEE Assembly

Adds the IEEE executive director as a non-voting member of the Board

*Enables future changes to IEEE governance*

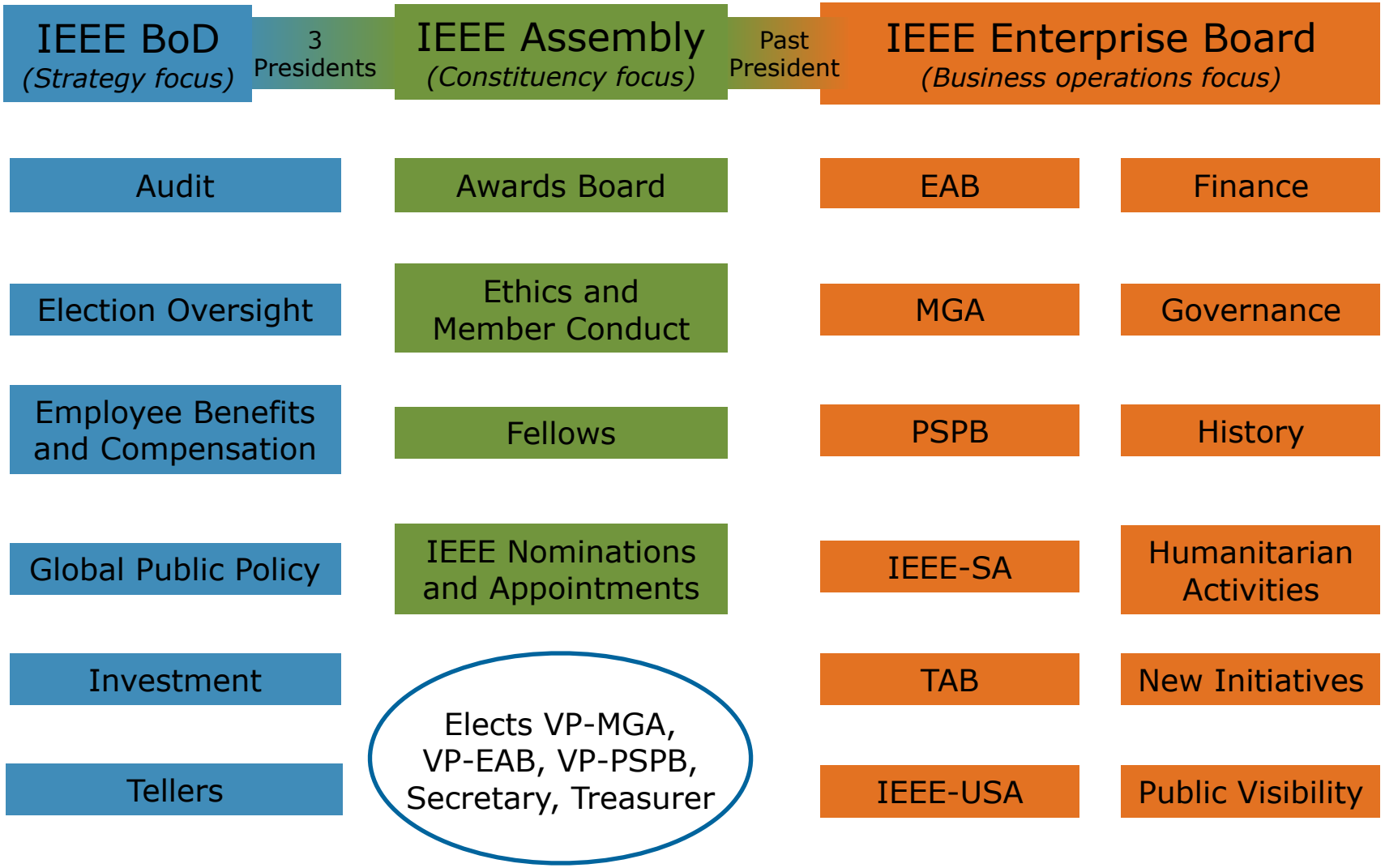
